Installation and Configuration Guide

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Author's Notes

For starters, don't let the size of this document scare you. The first half of the document is the **Installation**, which YES is of twenty seven (27) products, but most take less than a minute and the bulk of the material is screenshots telling you to take the default or "Click Next". Two installations take a little longer, one just over a minute and the other almost 5 minutes. Thus, the first half of this document should be quick and easy, taking less than an hour to fully complete.

There is one minor issue related to the Java installation to be aware of. The Java (x86) installation, once completed, tried to go to validate and upgrade to a newer version. Alone this is not a problem, but the Java (x64) version, does not do this verification nor upgrade automatically, leaving you at the end with Java versions that are out of sync (not a proper configuration). The recommendation is to ignore the Verify and Upgrade during installation of all of the products, this keeps both Java version at the same (7u55) version and then later if you wish manually upgrade both version of Java.

The **Database Creation** section has a lot of material but much of it is redundant. If at all possible use the **MS SQL Method 1 – Attach Starter Database** to attach the "Starter Database", this method has always worked for us and seems to not have any issues. **MS SQL Method 2 – Create Starter Database** produces Warning messages each time, which to date don't seem to be a problem, but it may be a reason for concern later on. The funny thing is, when using the identical **MS SQL Method 2 - Creating TRAVEL, TRAVEL_E, ORDERS, and ORDERS_E Databases** there were no Warning messages.

Licensing of Datamaker is pretty simple and straight forward. It takes a day to get the License Key back, so go to the **Generate the Candidate Key** section just as soon as you finish the **Connecting to Test Data Repository** section. Then while you are waiting for the **License key**, go ahead and create the TRAVEL, TRAVEL_E, ORDERS, and ORDERS_E databases, which you will need once you complete the **Applying the License Key** section. This is because Datamaker needs databases to connect to before everything can be accessed and configured. Licensing of the other products (Agile Designer, Fast Data Masker, and Javelin) is done differently using a product called Code Meter. We'll document these steps shortly.

The **Configuration** section is still a little confusing and needs to be validated. But we think we have covered all of the material and steps that you need to get Datamaker fully operational.

Introduction

Grid-Tools – is a suite of the world’s most powerful synthetic test data generation products that provide market-leading software solutions for provisioning the right data, to the right place, at the right time so that it can be used for rigorous testing.

The following is a step-by-step Best Practice Guide for installing, creating, licensing, and configuring the Grid-Tools suite of products using the **GTServer Setup Wizard**. In general, there are four major steps required to make the product operational:

- A. Installation
- B. Database Creation
- C. Licensing
- D. Configuration

Installation – using the **GTServer Setup Wizard** this process is greatly simplified, however be prepared because it installs the following products in sequence automatically:

5. Visual C++ 2010 SP1 x64 (MFC Security Update)

8. Visual C++ Redistributable for Visual Studio 2012 x64
9. SQL Server Native client 2008R2 x64
10. CodeMeter Runtime Kit x64
11. Adobe Reader XI
12. ODP4.NET Deployer
13. GTRemotePublish
14. GT Group Job Executor
15. GT HP ALM Service
16. GT ALM Batch
17. GTDatamaker
18. AgileDesigner
19. TestDataVisualizer
20. GT – Test Data On Demand
21. GTSDM

Most of the installations take less than a minute and require very little user interaction with the exception of clicking “Next” and taking the default entry. This section is mostly screenshots with a few notations that point out anomalies or issues that you might encounter.

Database Creation – is somewhat simple because you can download the **Datamaker Installation Kit** (datamaker_installation_kit##.zip) which has prebuilt “Starter Databases” for Oracle and MS SQL. With these databases you simply copy them to the Database Server and then “Attach” them as if they were an existing database.

The **Datamaker Installation Kit** also contains the files to create the “Starter Database”. Using this method the database is manually created, and then using the files provide in the Kit, commands are executed that create the Database Schemas and import Data.

Also included in the Datamaker Installation Kit are folders and file for creating various other databases that are used for training, and could be used for demonstration and POC purposes.

Licensing – is a required for several of the Grid-Tools products:

- Agile Designer
- GT Fast Data Masker
- Datamaker
- GT Subset
- Quick Design
- Portus Control Centre
- Mainframe (DBOS by Syncosrt)
- Javelin

In some cases you will need to generate a request which is linked to the computer where you have installed Grid-Tools. In other cases you will need to request a license through Support.

Configuration – of the product consists of telling the various Grid-Tools applications where the database and other applications are and how to access them. There are two main Services which must be configured so that they will run:

- GridToolsRemotePublish
- GridToolsTDoDService

Additionally, after you are able to fully access Datamaker you will want to create a REP.XML file to simplify the login process.

Download

To install the Grid-Tools suite of products download the latest version of **setup_GTServer.exe** at the following link:

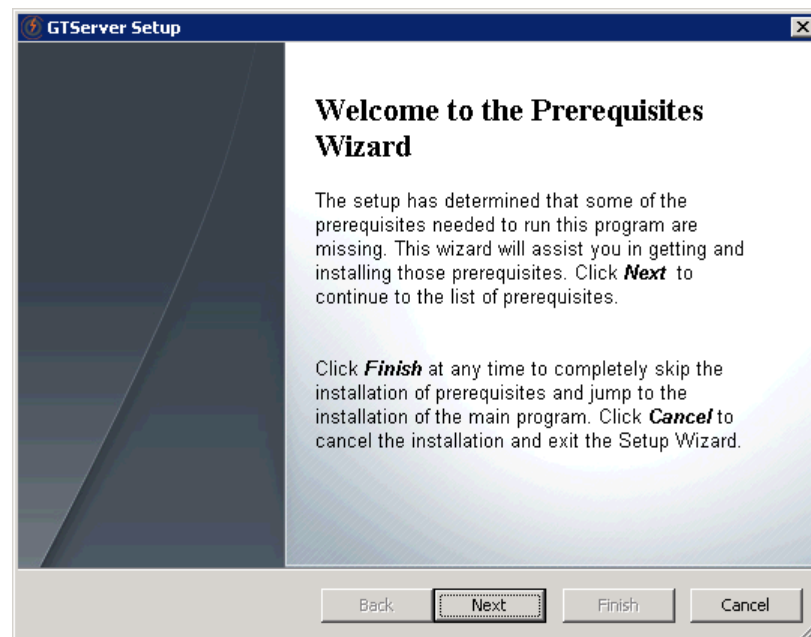
Installation

The best way to install the Grid-Tools suite of products is to download the latest version of the **GTServer Setup Wizard (setup_GTServer.exe)**. The **Download** section of this document has the link for this download.

The **GTServer Setup Wizard** walks through each installation sequentially. The following is a step-by-step guide for using the GTServer Setup Wizard.

GTServer Setup – Prerequisites Wizard

1. Right click the **setup_GTServer** executable and select **Run as Administrator**

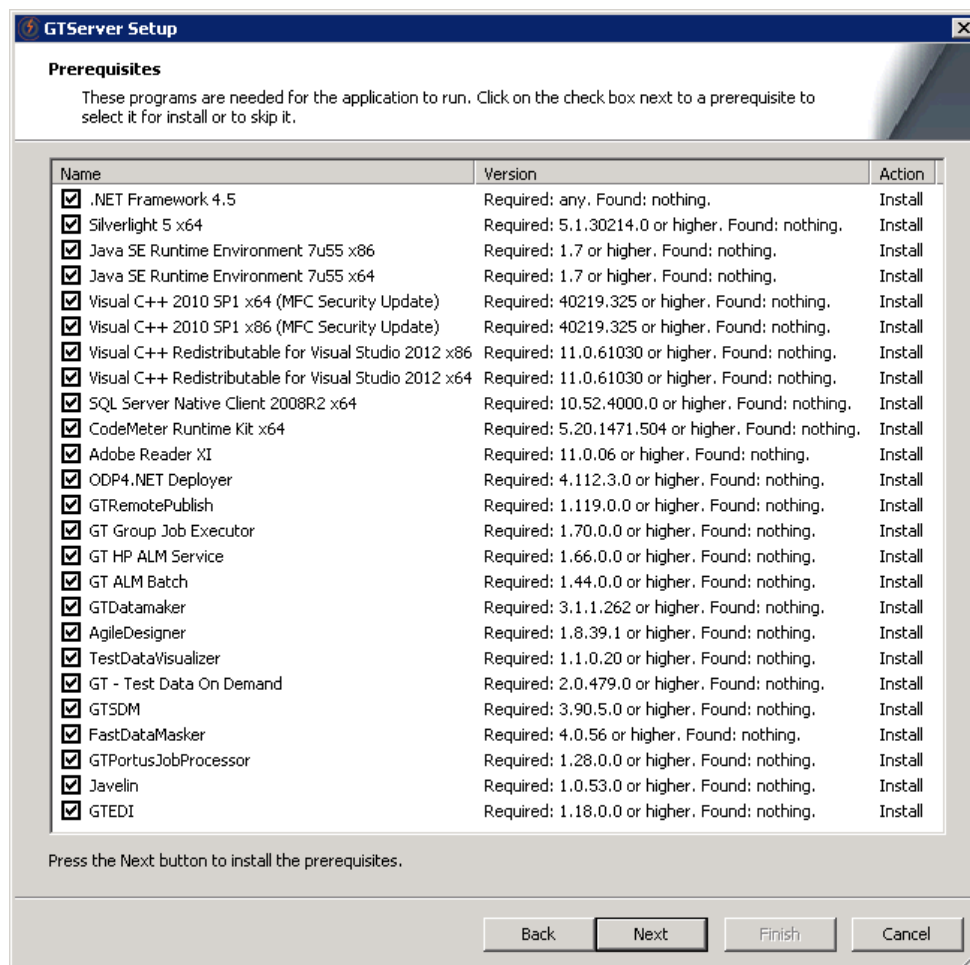


2. Click **Next**

The following are the Prerequisites and Applications that will be installed. In some cases, the **GTServer Setup Wizard** may detect a previous version that has already been installed. If so, it will check to see if the previous installation meets the prerequisite needs and then uncheck the box automatically saying the previous version is acceptable.

In most cases, all of the boxes will be checked. If you do not want to install a particular package simply uncheck that application and the installation will be skipped. Otherwise, each installation will follow in sequence (one after the other) walking through the installation of that particular application.

This window of the **GTServer Setup Wizard** will stay open as each individual product is installed, so if at any time you wish to check on the progress of all of the installation simple refer to this window.



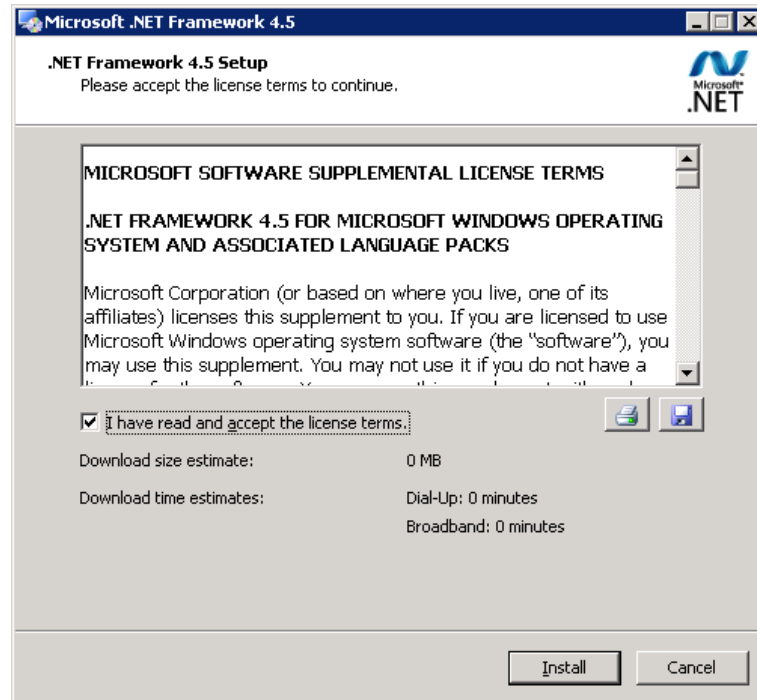
3. Verify that all of the applications you wish to install are checked

The **GTServer Setup Wizard** will extract all of the applications that it is about to install to the C:\Grid-Tools\Installers folder and start the installation of the first application.

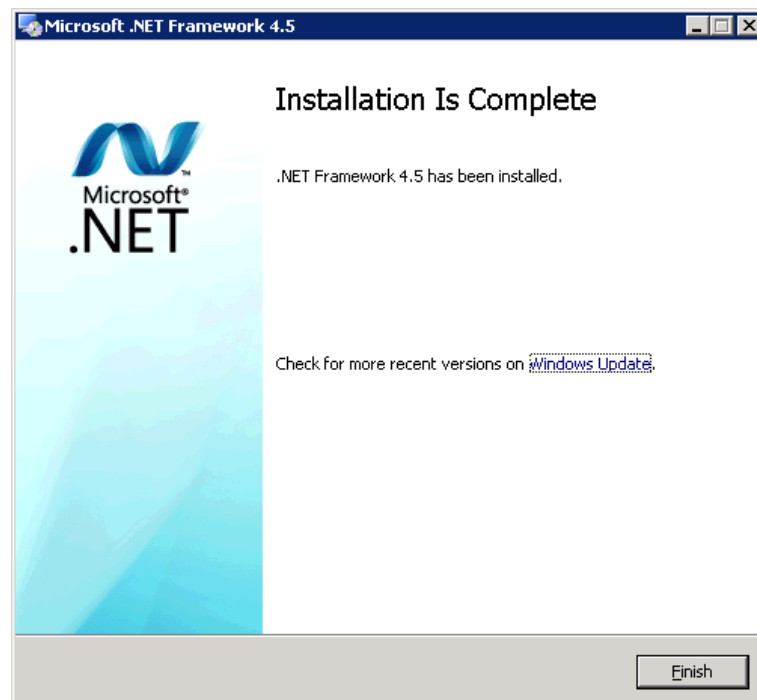

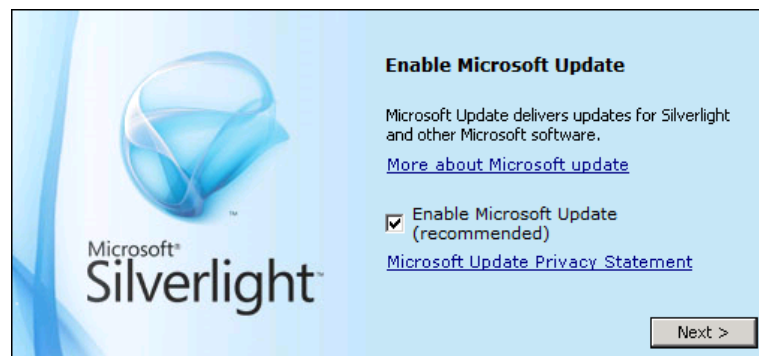

Best Practice: Both the Java x86 and Java x64 version should be in sync (same version number). If you run the Java Verify at this time the Java (x86) will update to the newer version. However, at the end of the Java (x64) installation this does not happen, leaving you with different versions. Since the Grid-Tools products will run on this version don't verify and update at this time and then later if you wish manually update both versions.

Database Creation

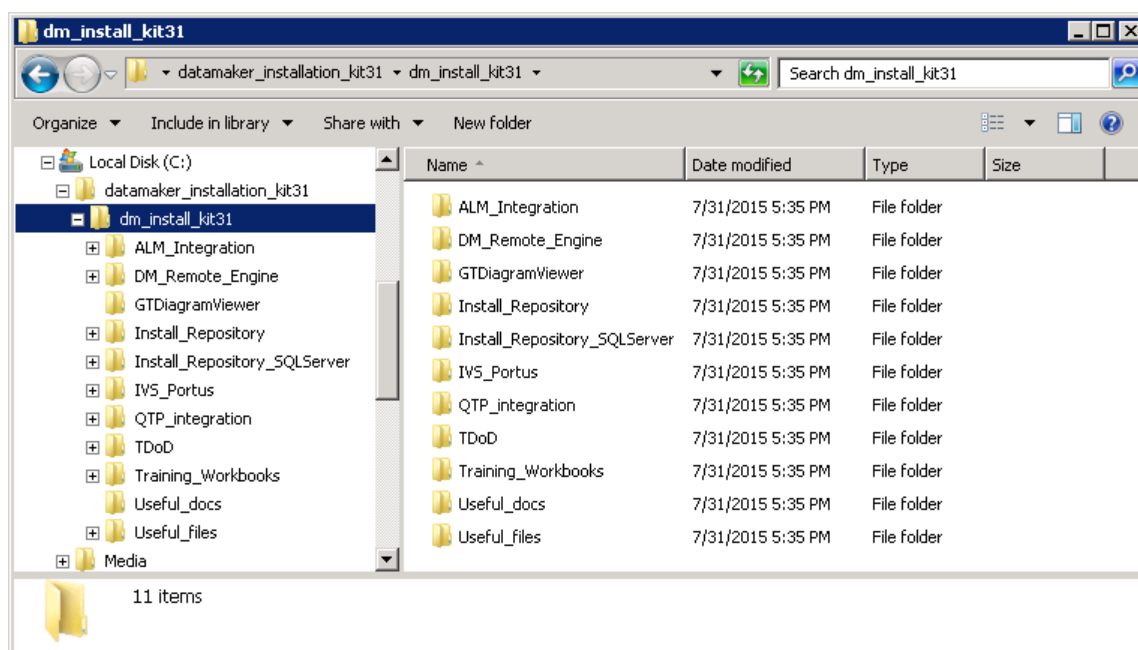
Prerequisite – Install Database Server

The “Starter Database” is used by DataMaker and the other Grid-Tools products as an initial Repository. This database can be either Oracle or Microsoft SQL. Because the **Datamaker Installation Kit** contains the schema and data to build the tables, the only prerequisite is to install one of these database servers.

Datamaker Installation Kit

Once the Grid-Tools suite of products is installed, a “Starter Database” needs to be created for the products to use as a Repository. To assist in this effort Grid-Tools has created a **Datamaker Installation Kit (datamaker_installation_kit##.zip)**. This Kit is used to create the “Starter Database”, training databases, and has other useful material. The **Download** section of this document has the link for this download.

Once you have downloaded the **Datamaker Installation Kit**, extract the compressed (ZIP) file. It will create the following directory structure.



Of key interest are the following two folders which will be used to create the Databases:

- **Install_Repository** Used for Oracle
- **Install_Repository_SQLServer** Used for Microsoft SQL Server

The following are the step-by-step instructions for creating the Datamaker “Starter Database” using the **Datamaker Installation Kit** files.

Note: At this time MS SQL Server has been documented, Oracle steps will be completed soon, but a README is provided in the Install_Repository folder if needed.

MS SQL Server

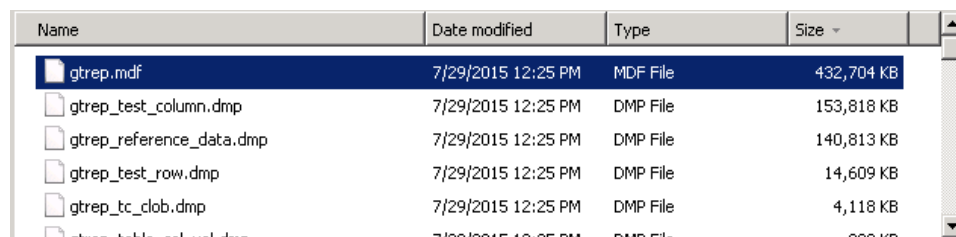
Before proceeding this document assumes the following:

- Microsoft SQL Server is installed
- Microsoft SQL Server Management Studio is installed
- The User ID being used has permissions to create databases, tables, views, functions, procedures, indexes, primary keys, foreign keys, and constraints

There are two methods for creating the “Starter Database”. The first simply attaches an existing prebuilt database. The second has you create a database and then import schemas and data using standard utilities.

MS SQL Method 1 – Attach Starter Database

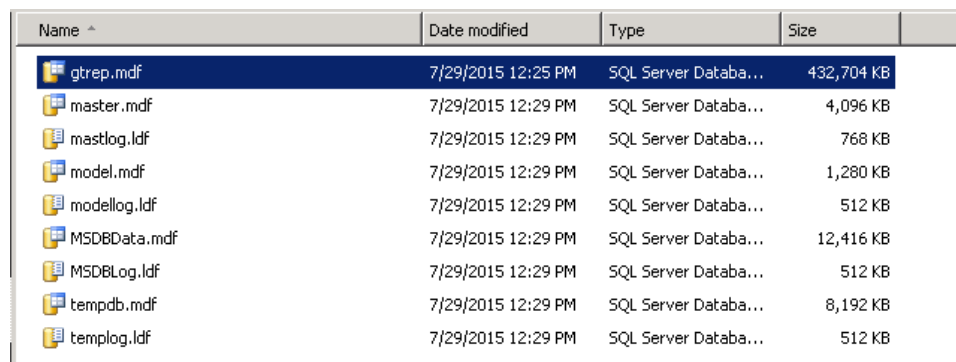
1. Open Windows Explorer and go to the extracted Datamaker Installation Kit folders
2. Go to the **Install_Repository_SQLServer** folder and sort the files by Size

Final Note: The removal of the log file eliminates error messages and other issues when attaching the database. Once the database is connected and in use a new log file will be created as can be seen above.

The README File indicates that if for some reason you are having trouble attaching the MDF file from the MS SQL Server database file systems (DATA Folder) that you should move the MDF file to the Backup Folder and try to attach from there.

C:\Program Files\Microsoft SQL Server\MSSQL11.SQLEXPRESS64BIT\MSSQL\Backup

The assumption here is that there might be folder and file permission issues.

Personal Note:

The **MS SQL Method 1 – Attach Starter Database** method has always worked successfully for me but we went ahead and validated the MS SQL Method 2 – Create Starter Database because as you will see this method is used when creating the training databases Travel and Travel_E.

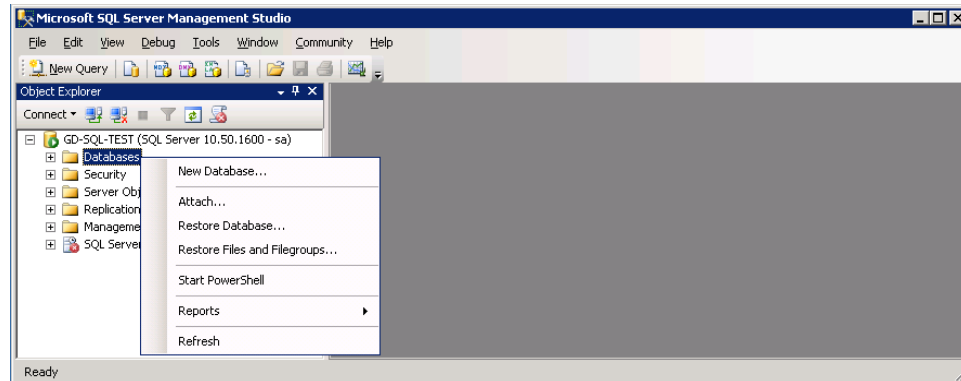
If you were successful attaching the prebuilt database then for training or POC purposes you may want to proceed to the **MS SQL Method 2 – Create Travel and Travel_E Databases** section and add those databases.

MS SQL Method 2 – Create Starter Database

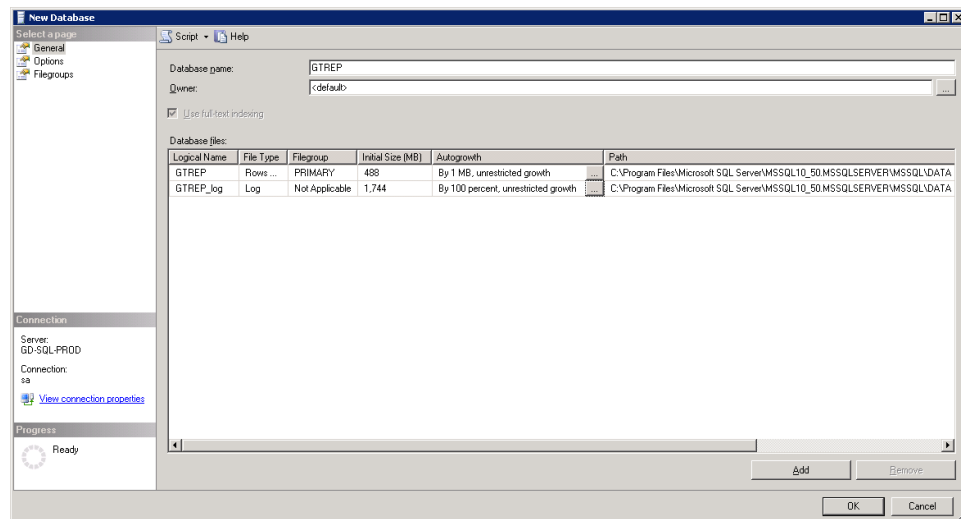
The following method will have you manually create the database, run a SQL Query to add the Schema to the database, and then execute a batch file from a Command Prompt that will load the Data into the database.

Create the GTREP Database

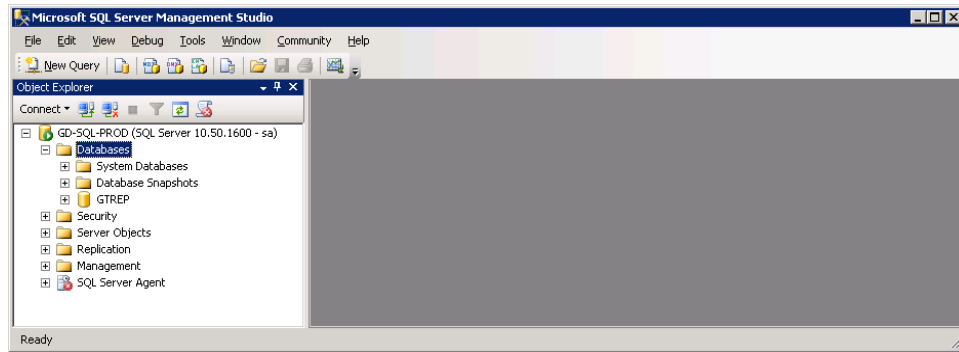
1. Open the **Microsoft SQL Server Management Studio**



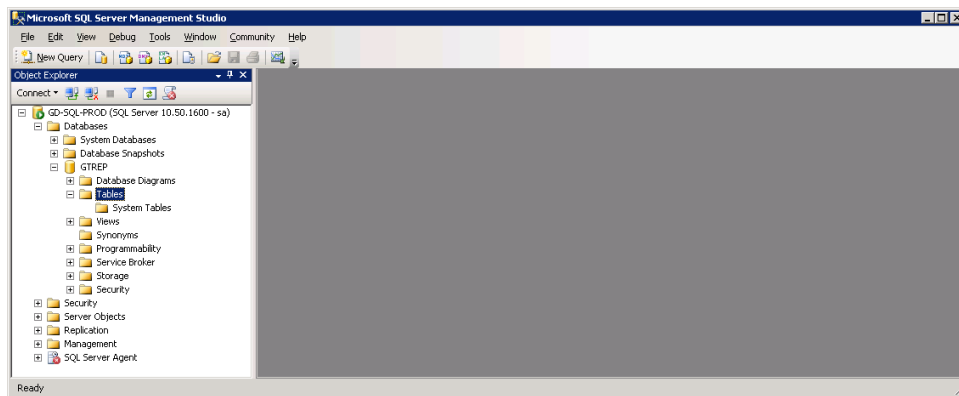
2. Right click **Databases** and select **New Database**



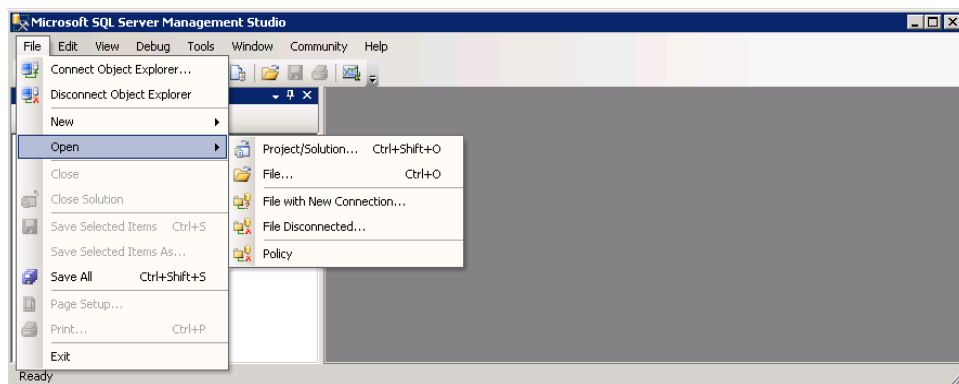
3. For the **Database Name** enter **GTREP**
4. For the database file in the PRIMARY Filegroup make the following changes:
 - a. Set the **Initial Size** to **488 MB**
 - b. Verify that the **Autogrowth** is set to **“By 1 MB, unrestricted growth”**
5. For the second entry (GTREP_log) make the following changes:
 - a. Set the **Initial Size** to **1788 MB**

Once the command is executed three (3) files will be created:

- **import_report.txt** – this file will open once the command has executed. Check this file for IMPORT errors. Once you close this file the command will finish.
- **gtrep_import_log.txt** – located in the Install_Repository_SQLServer folder. Check this file for “errors” to make sure no commands failed
- **gtrep_import_errors.txt** – located in the Install_Repository_SQLServer folder. It should be empty and will only have information if there are DOS command errors.

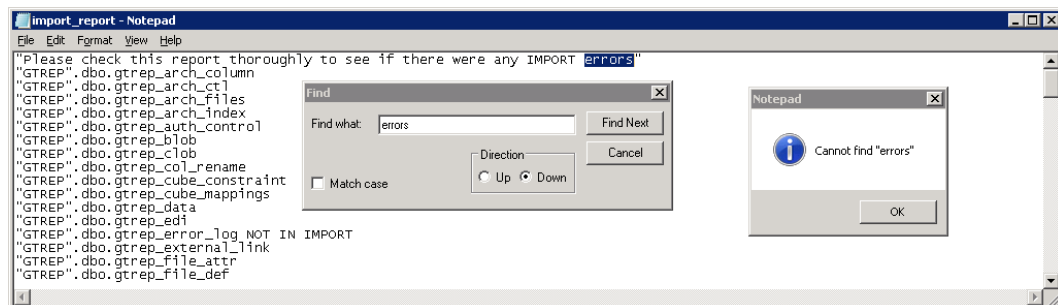

Connecting to the Test Data Repository

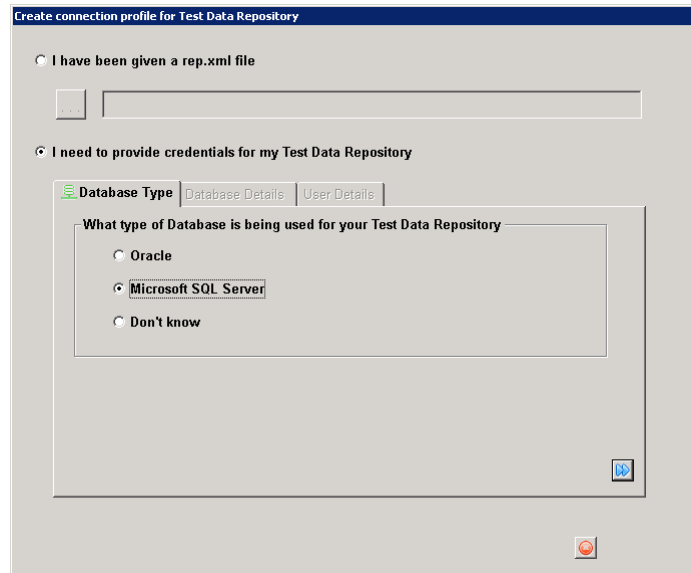

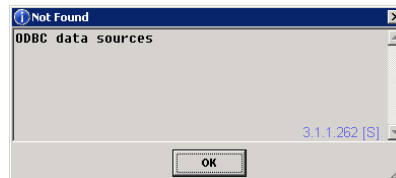
Because there is not a Profile to the Test Data Repository the **Create connection profile for Test Data Repository** window (Step 2) will automatically pop up. - **Connect to Test Data Repository** will only work once the Test Data Repository Profile is created. If you click it now you will get an error message. 
- **Create new Profile** (which is covered in Step 2 of this section) pulls up the **Create connection profile for Test Data Repository** window. Initially because there is no Profile, this is why it automatically popping up, forcing you to create a connection. 
- **Help about GT Datamaker** provides version numbers and DLL dates which can be emailed to Grid-Tools if needed. 

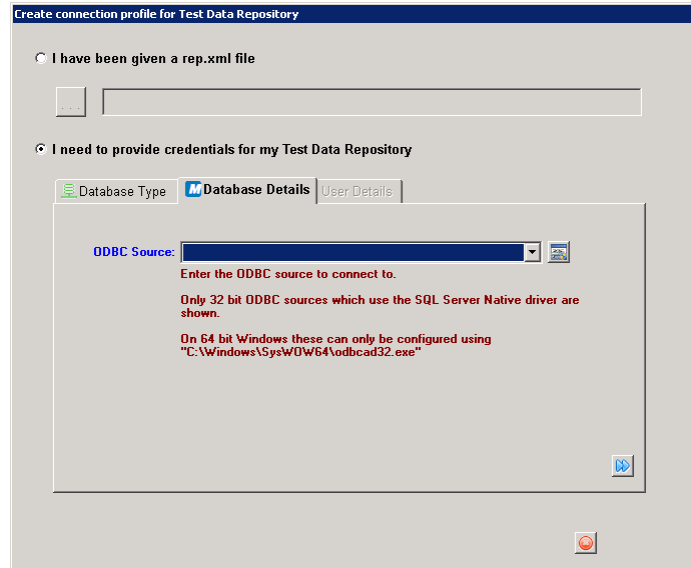

Recommendation:

Now that Datamaker is connected to the Test Data Repository, the next step is to License Grid-Tools. Since this usually takes a day or so, we recommend you go to the Licensing section of this document and perform the steps in the **Generate Candidate Key** section immediately.

Once Datamaker is licensed, you may need sample or training databases to connect to for testing and to validate that everything is configured correctly. So while you are waiting for the **License Key**, go to the next section and create the TRAVEL and TRAVEL_E databases.

Then when you receive your **License Key** go to the **Applying the Licensing Key** section and activate Datamaker using the License key.

Then, because you need Source and Target databases, go ahead and build Profiles and connect to the TRAVEL and TRAVEL_E databases.

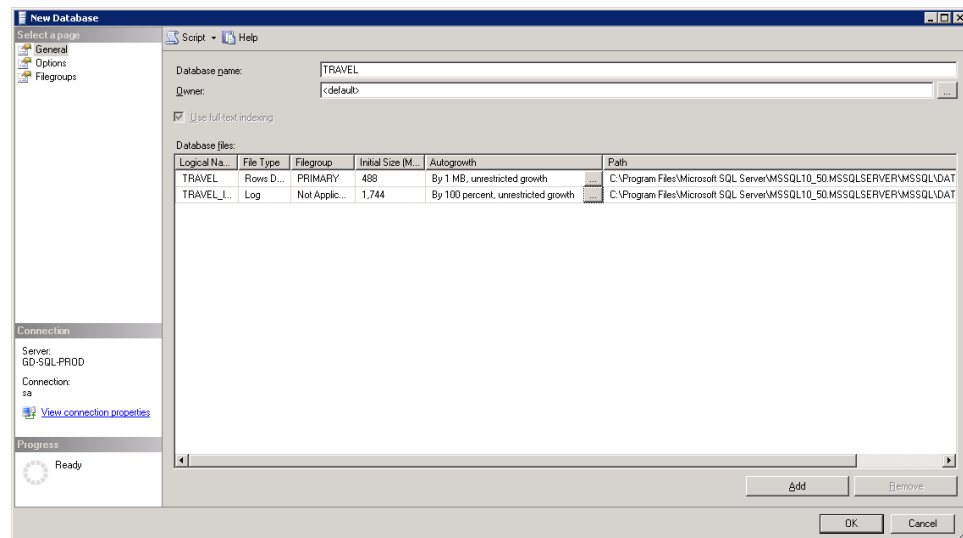
MS SQL Method 2 – Create Travel and Travel_E Databases

If you are attending training or needing additional databases for a demonstration or POC, by following the same methodology additional databases can be created. Located in the Datamaker Installation Kit Install_Repository_SQLServer folder is another folder called **Install_TRAVEL_SQL_Server**. In this folder are the files needed to create the Schema and import the Data for a set of “Travel” databases.

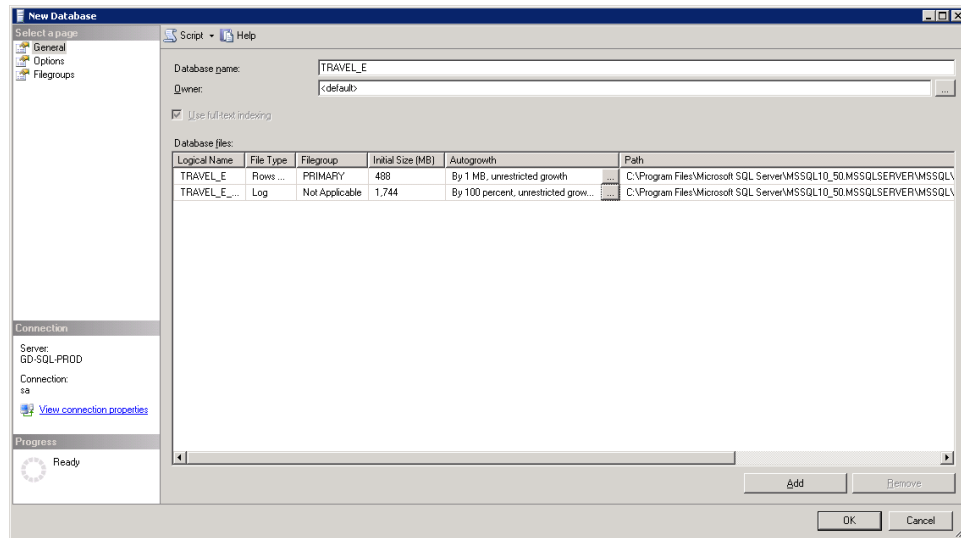
For training purposes you will want to create two (2) databases and run the SQL Query to create Schemas in both of these databases. However, only on one of the databases will you import Data. This way Datamaker can be used to pull, mask, subset, etc. data from the fully loaded database to the empty but ready database.

Create the Travel Databases

Licensing

Before starting this section the Datamaker product must be installed, the “Starter Database” or Test Data Repository must be created, and a Datamaker Profile created so that Datamaker can connect to the Test Data Repository.



Generating the Candidate Key
